





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Fresh Peach Crumble Bars



Yield 20

Crust/Crumb topping:

1 cup granulated sugar

3 cups all-purpose flour

1 teaspoon baking powder

1/2 teaspoon salt

1/4 teaspoon ground cinnamon

1 cup unsalted butter cold, cut into cubes

1 large egg, lightly beaten

Peach layer:

1/2 cup granulated sugar

1 tablespoon cornstarch

1/4 teaspoon ground cinnamon

5 large peaches, peeled and diced

1 teaspoon fresh lemon juice

Icing:

1 cup powdered sugar

1/4 teaspoon almond extract

1 tablespoon milk (more or less for desired consistency)

Directions:

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 F if using a glass pan or dark metal pan, or 375 F for a light metal pan. Lightly grease or spray a 13 x 9-inch baking pan and set aside.
- 2. In a medium bowl, whisk together 1 cup of sugar, 3 cups of flour, baking powder, salt and cinnamon. Using a pastry cutter, blend in the butter until the mixture resembles coarse sand. Add the lightly beaten egg and mix until the dough starts to hold together, but is still crumbly. Gently press a little more than half the dough into the prepared pan. (Optional: Use a food processor to process these ingredients.)
- 3. In a large mixing bowl, whisk together the sugar, cornstarch and cinnamon. Add the diced peaches and toss to combine. Drizzle the lemon juice over the peaches and toss to coat. Pour the peach mixture over the crust and spread evenly.
- 4. Using your hands, press together handfuls of the remaining crumb topping to create clumps. Scatter the clumps and remaining crumbled topping over the fruit layer, leaving some peaches showing through.
- 5. If using a glass pan, bake at 350 F for 50 to 55 minutes or until lightly browned. If using a metal pan, bake at 375 F for 40 to 45 minutes. Cool completely, then chill before cutting and icing.
- 6. Whisk together the powdered sugar, almond extract and milk. Drizzle on the bars just before serving.



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
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

Recent Updates...

Spokane Valley City Council - August 13, 2024

This meeting of the Spokane Valley City Council opened in its formal format with an invocation by Pastor Brad Bruszer of the Genesis Church, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance. There were no proclamations.

On June 20th, 2023, Council adopted Resolution 23-007, its six-year Transportation Improvement Plan (TIP). Included in that plan was the Trent Avenue Access Control Safety Improvements Project for completion in 2024. In developing the Spokane Valley Local Road Safety Plan (LRSP), crash trends were identified along Trent Avenue (SR-290) and similar arterials, including T-bone and left-turn crashes related to driveway and side street access.

This project includes left turn channelization for turning off and onto Trent at Dale Lane, McDonald Road, and Evergreen Road. The project is fully funded by a grant from the Highway Safety Improvement Program. The engineer's estimate for the project cost was \$264,482. The successful bidder for construction was Liberty Concrete with a bid of \$264,290. The motion to award the bid to Liberty Concrete passed unanimously.

The second action item on Council's agenda was awarding the bid for the Indiana Avenue Preservation Project, Phase 1, to Cameron Reilly, LLC. That project was also on the six-year TIP adopted in Resolution 23-007. The successful bid was \$1,220,901 for the construction phase of the project. That bid was 11.7% less than the engineer's estimate of the cost at \$1,381,896. The project will reconstruct the roadway between Sullivan Road and the I-90 westbound off-ramp with concrete pavement. The motion to award the contract to Cameron Reilly, LLC passed unanimously.

Recently, from June 23rd-25th, a delegation from Spokane region visited Whatcom County to learn how the County and surrounding cities have successfully worked together to pass a public safety sales tax ballot measure last year. City Manager John Hohman and Chamber President Lance Beck attended on behalf of Spokane Valley. The visit was intended to initiate discussions on public health, safety, and justice in the Spokane region. Ideas for collaboration, and cooperation of the several participants to pass the region's own funding for public safety are under discussion.

In June 2023, Council elected to participate in a three-year interlocal agreement with the Spokane County CDBG (Community Development Block Grant) Consortium. The City has been working with the County Housing and Community Development for periodic updates on the overall five-year plan required by federal law. Per the prior agreement with Spokane County, \$780,596 was set aside for 2023. Although the plan is county-wide, the process for the City's allocation from the finalized consolidated plan will determine how future City set asides will be prioritized and awarded.

The City has been a participant in four negotiations and payments from opioid manufacturers and vendors legal settlements. Thus far, the City has received \$99,226 with a possible \$333,889 yet to be received through 2038. A possible fifth settlement amount may be forthcoming from a remaining litigant (Purdue). This evening's discussion focused on possible uses for those funds. Because the annual received amounts are rather small in meeting the overall needs of an opioid mitigation program, the discussion was directed toward a regional funding consolidation plan for a more effective use of the funds.

Council annually reviews its adopted goals and priorities for how it uses lodging tax revenues, encouraging the Lodging Tax Committee to consider those when making award recommendations. In summary, those goals and priorities are:

- 1. To direct awards toward funding projects, activities, events, or festivals that will highlight Spokane Valley as a tourism destination. Lodging taxes will be used for purposes allowed by State law including:
 - a. Tourism marketing
 - b. Marketing and operation of special events and festivals
 - c. Operation and capital expenditures for tourism related facilities owned or operated by a municipality or public facilities district
 - d. Operation of tourism related facilities owned or operated by non-profit organizations
- Prioritize funding for destination marketing projects that promote the City as a tourist destination and for capital expenditures to develop tourism destination facilities or venues within Spokane Valley as a means of drawing additional visitors to the City.
- 3. Priority consideration will be given to projects with a history of increasing overnight stays and the shopping, dining, and overnight visit components in that category.
- 4. Council will take into consideration revenues received by applicants that were derived from other sources within Spokane Valley and other municipal entities and agencies such as any standing Tourism Promotion Authority and the Spokane Public Facilities District.
- 5. The City will now accept applications from applicants other than non-profit entities for tourism promotion projects.

Goals and Priorities for use of the Lodging Tax are set annually by Council. Those goals for 2025 are for funding to be in these award categories.

- a. Capital expenditures funding will be available up to \$2,554,000
- b. Tourism marketing and operations for special events and festivals will be up to \$339,000 for 2025.

Priority is given to projects with the greatest tourism potential to produce overnight room lodging, shipping, and dining. In order to avoid partially funding projects Council will prioritize the awards by use of a priority ranking system to allocate available funds based on Council voting. This process is scheduled to come before Council for a Motion Consideration on August 20th.

Spokane County's Housing Community Development Advisory Committee (HCDAC) serves as an advisory committee to the board of County Commissioners. It reviews all of the funding proposals for housing, homeless, and community development

administered by Spokane County including federal entitlement funds. Spokane Valley, based on population, is entitled to four representatives. Currently, Deputy Mayor Tim Hattenburg, Councilman Ben Wick, and Tom Hormel (citizen representative), sit on the committee for the City. The fourth position is currently vacant. Mayor Haley intends to appoint Gloria Mantz, City Services Administrator, to the position. Consensus was reached to bring the appointment to a future meeting.

Council, during a past meeting, requested a presentation regarding "squatters' rights." A "squatter" is someone "who settles on property without any legal claim or title" as opposed to a "holdover tenant" who moves onto property with a legal right. Property owners are largely prohibited from self-help means to removing a squatter. Under Washington law, squatters may be removed through 1) legal action by the property owner, or 2) by law enforcement for trespassing. Option 1 (unlawful detainer process) requires the property owner to proceed through the court system to acquire a court order that law enforcement can enforce against the squatter. Option 2 (removal by law enforcement for trespass) enables a property owner to seek assistance from law enforcement to remove a person who enters their property without permission. The report was prompted by the recent U.S. Supreme Court's decision regarding homeless rights on public and private property.

City Council has the authority to establish its own rules of procedure, policies, and standards of conduct. Such policies and procedures are identified in its Governance Manual. As times, rules and procedures change, the manual is periodically updated. The proposed changes brought forward by the Governance Manual Committee address in part the following:

- Addition of policy that costs for social media archiving platform shall be deducted from each Councilmember's individual annual budget.
- Addition of policies regarding posting false information to social media.
- Addition of new policies for conduct of meetings, i.e., all meetings, both formal and study sessions will begin with an invocation and flag salute.
- A revised section H to address electronic accounts use by Council members.

Council reached consensus to bring back the modifications for a motion consideration at a future meeting.

Spokane Valley City Council meetings are held in City Hall, 10210 E. Sprague Avenue, on Tuesdays, commencing at 6:00pm. City Hall is open for regular business during normal business hours (8:00am to 5:00pm). I had some more fun catching sockeye on Lake Wenatchee last week. Fishing continues to be fantastic. I also hear that the sockeye fishing on the Brewster Pool continues to be great. Now I want to get up to Banks Lake to do some walleye and smallmouth bass fishing. This is one of my favorite things to do in the summer.


What an incredible sockeye sea-

son! Over 755,000 entered the Columbia River, according to the counts at Bonneville Dam. As you know, most of these traveled up the Columbia River and on into Canada. Anglers who fish the Brewster Pool have been cashing in on the abundance of sockeye and continue to do so. I plan to make one last trip to the Brewster Pool this week, to try to get a few of these Columbia River fish. I took a look at the reader board at Tumwater Dam recently, and it had posted over 166,000 sockeye passing through on their way to Lake Wenatchee and then onto the spawning beds in the White River. According to the Chelan PUD, it was over 168,000. I will make a couple more trips and then move my boat back home. The quality of the fish has held up amazingly well this season, and I want to take advantage of this. Nothing like having a freezer full of sockeye for the table and for the

smoker. I had a ton of fun fishing Lake Wenatchee this season and was able to take many members of my family out. We have some great memories from these trips.

Last year Rob Phillips, outdoor writer for the Yakima Herald-Republic, came up to Lake Wenatchee to fish with me. He had such a good time that when I invited him up again he was eager to make the trip. Last season the fishing was terrific on the day he was here, and I was a bit nervous that I would not be able to repeat such quick limits for us. It was a bit windy when we got to the lake, but nothing like some other mornings that I fished Lake Wenatchee this season. I moved up the lake a ways, put the gear out, and trolled toward the top end. I sweated as each minute passed without strike, but soon the bite came on. When it did we were busy. We got fish on the downriggers that had either three black-hook rigs or red hooks behind double dodgers. I had black and red hooks out the back on eight ounce lead balls, and these rods were bouncing, too. We ended the morning with a double and had to release one fish. I checked my watch, and it did take me 20 minutes longer than last year to get our limits. This week's photo is of Rob with one of the sockeye he landed that morning.

Although I have been cursing the wind at Lake Wenatchee this sock-



eve season, it has been my experience that it actually has been a blessing. I have had much better fishing on windy days than when it was flat calm, which has been rare. On Tuesday, Rob Phillips and I were headed to the dock by seven in the morning with our limits. When Rollie saw me coming he texted me asking if we were okay. He didn't expect me to finish so early! We had a nice breeze that morning. On Wednesday, Tom Verschuren and I arrived at the lake to find it dead calm. We spent some time at the top end of the lake and talked to several anglers that agreed that the fishing was much slower that morning. We got a few up there and I trolled down the lake and out in the middle. I switched from black hooks to bright orange and pink and that changed things for us. We lost a few fish, including a really big

one right at the boat, but managed to get our eight fish by nine o'clock. You can still catch fish on a calm day, it just takes a little longer. Now I am hoping for some wind!

The Lake Wenatchee sockeye fishery is still going strong. Anglers are having good success, with many posting consistent limits. Wind has been an issue this season. Usually, we talk about the number of windy days compared to calm days on the lake, but this year has been the reverse. It has been the calm days that have been scarce. Recently

though, there has been a string of clear skies and calm water, and talking to other anglers on the water they agree that the action can often be slower with these conditions. This is particularly true when the sun hits the water. About a week ago, when sockeye bites were getting to be far apart, I tried something different. Rather than the three red hook and three black hook setups that worked well in the morning, I dug out some of the brightest hooks and beads I had on hand. We limited fairly quickly after the switch. Now I am doing it every day with very good results. It reminded me that you have to be willing to experiment to have success. I am also fishing much deeper to get my sockeye now, too.

I have a very disappointed neighbor. Calder Fiske, who was planning to have a Kids Fishing Derby at Blackbird Island Pond in Leavenworth, is canceling the event. Calder told me he went down to the pond on a calm day last week, when he could take a good look for fish. He didn't see a single trout. Rather than go ahead and have no fish caught, he is going to change his plans for a Kids Fishing Derby to next spring. The WDFW always plants a bunch of catchable size trout in Blackbird Island Pond for kids to catch through the spring and summer. He will have his derby then, when the pond is full of hungry fish. He is sorry for the delay. He had already received the medals he ordered for the winners and was about to put up the posters for the event. We both agreed that it is better to wait.

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



Taking care of all the wounded soldiers and those that died in the hospital was very hard on me, especially dealing with the many children who came to the main base hospital to receive medical help with injuries caused by IEDs, mines, or a stray bullet. It totally broke my heart and spirit & caused some anxiety, stress & mild PTSD and I came close to taking my own life.

All I can say is Thank You Jesus for sparing my life. After I retired from the US Military I heard about a minister called Pastor James working with the homeless & people that society "don't have time for" in Texas. He runs a street ministry & brings the homeless to his ranch to help them get off the streets & bring hope to their lives. I contacted him and he invited me to come down and work with him. So my dog DJ and I packed up our stuff and started our adventure!

DJ and I spent 3 years working with Pastor James ministering to the homeless, drug addicts and many others who needed help. Then DJ and I bid farewell to Texas and headed to Orlando, Florida to spend time with my daughter. During that time DJ got very sick & passed away, it was very hard on me losing my best friend. I was alone again, even though I had family around who cared for me, it was really difficult to lose my emotional support

I returned back to Texas to work with Pastor James and discovered he had taken in a stray pregnant female German Shepherd. Soon after my arrival she had 8 puppies and he allowed me to take the first pick of the litter

to pay me back for my hard work and to help with the loss of DJ. One of the female puppies caught my attention, and I named her Rhema!

In 2019, I came back to Spokane to help my ageing parents and my Mom passed away. I thank God I had Rhema to help me through the loss of my Mom.

I knew Rhema needed more training, and someone told me about Operation Dog Tag and Joe's Scheffer training abilities, so I contacted him to ask if he would help me train Rhema. The training I got was very good and helpful. I totally recommend Joe to all you veterans with PTSD, or any war related trauma to first call out to Jesus, he will come and help you through your situation and second, get a dog and contact Joe to help you train your dog and assist you with your war trauma and PTSD. God created dogs and He put his love, compassion, loyalty, protection and care in these animals. This shows how much God loves us, bringing a dog into your life can bring you joy.

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
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

TIMES HAVE CHANGED



A recent class action lawsuit is now settled and ratified by the court concerning an accusation against the National Association of Realtors* and some prominent real estate franchises. Basically, the controversial lawsuit accused NAR of price fixing. The suit accused respondents of requiring Realtor* owned MLS's (Multiple Listing Services) to keep commissions at a certain level and even though the accusation is patently false, the parties agreed to settle.

Not all MLS's are Realtor® owned, and those MLS's are not bound to this settlement. Spokane Realtors® organization (formerly known as the Spokane Association of Realtors®) is so named because they require all brokers to belong to the NAR in order to subscribe to their services. All of the brokers subscribing to that local MLS therefore are subject to the requirements of the settlement.

There has never been any requirement by NAR or SR to fix commissions in a certain range. Commissions have always been negotiable. Sellers have never been forced to pay a buyer' brokers commission, but it has always made sense to do so because most buyers typically don't have the money to pay a broker.

One of the requirements of the settlement is that, (starting on August 17, 2024) MLS's can no longer publish the commission amount that a seller will pay to a buyer's broker. The authors of the settlement evidently thought that by keeping that a secret it will prompt more negotiation between brokers and clients and between sellers and buyers on the topic of commission. Does that new practice benefit consumers? We shall see.

Instead of benefitting consumers it may make the whole buying process more cumbersome. It remains to be seen if consumers will get any benefit out that settlement forced business practice.

What it means is that a buyer's broker will have to check each and every listing by calling the listing broker to see if that seller has incentivized buyers by offering a buyers side commission. Washington State Agency Law was recently modified to require buyer's brokers to have a written agreement before offering broker services to any buyer. So, buyers will have to commit to pay a broker their fee before they ever know if a seller will agree to pay all or a portion of that compensation. Buyers will have to be more committed than they ever have been in the past.

Will that ultimately mean lower real estate prices because of lower negotiated commissions? That outcome seems possible, but doubtful.

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
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REIF PREVAILS AT TRI-CITY FOR SECOND CONSECUTIVE VICTORY

WEST RICHLAND, Wash. (Aug. 10, 2024) — Race fans who waited more than two decades to witness an ARCA Menards Series West event at Tri-City Raceway were provided a glimpse into NASCAR's future during Saturday's NAPA Auto Care 150.

Tyler Reif and Sean Hingorani, who entered the evening separated by five points in the West Series standings, were the two cars to beat through all 150 laps. Reif would be the one to prevail, by .485 seconds, besting Hingorani during a late-race restart to earn his second consecutive West Series victory.

Trailing Hingorani for most of the night, Reif didn't think he'd be able challenge him if the race had gone uninterrupted to the checkered flag.

One last restart with 18 laps left gave Reif the opening he was looking for. A perfectly timed restart from the outside line allowed him to make the race-winning pass on Hingorani.

"The laps were counting down faster and faster," Reif said. "Those cautions surprised me, but we did what we had to do during those last 75 laps. We practiced on the outside a little bit this weekend and it definitely paid off tonight."

Jack Wood settled for third in the NAPA Auto Care 150 with Todd Souza and Kyle Keller completing the top five. NASCAR legend Greg Biffle, a previous Tri-City track champion, ran in the top five for most of the night, but finished ninth after a late spin.

Notable locals in the field included Ephrata's Kasey Kleyn in sixth finishing all 150 laps, Jeff Havens from Spokane also finished all laps and was eighth while Danica Dart, also from Ephrata, was two laps down and 14th in the 15-car field.

This was the first appearance of the series at Tri City Raceway since June 21, 2003 when Jason Jefferson won the race. Then the series was known as NASCAR Winston West.

TELLSTROM MAKES HISTORY IN 'IDAHO 208' VICTORY

Meridian, Idaho (Aug. 10, 2024) — Duplicating the feat of Jeremy Doss in 2020, Kyle Tellstrom doubled down on his "Idaho 200" win at Stateline Speedway with a victory in the "YMC Mechanical Idaho 208" at Meridian Speedway just weeks apart.

He also won the Pro Late Model portion of the "Idaho 208" weekend to sweep the Late Model portion of events.

Tellstrom, from Ukiah, Calif., picked up over \$37,000 for those wins. He took home \$10,000 for his victory on Saturday, making him the only repeat winner in "Idaho 208" history. Tellstrom brought home the win in a Senneker Performance Super Late Model owned by Lee Hackney.

Jason Jefferson, John Newhouse, Aubree Cristiani and Wyatt King rounded out the top five.

"Honestly it is relieving", Tellstrom stated about becoming the first two-time winner of the "Idaho 208". "We have really worked hard this year, and it has been a lot of work between my crew and my guys."

Tellstrom started off his winning bid by setting the AFCO Racing / Longacre Racing Products Fast Time with a 13.211 second lap on the 1/4-mile oval. The reshuffled start saw Tellstrom start eighth but he moved carefully through the field to fifth by the break.

He eased past Jefferson on lap 117 to chase Newhouse for the lead in a hotly contested battle that ended in contact on lap 124 allowing Jefferson to regain the top spot.

Several laps later on lap 132 and following a caution, Tellstrom took the lead and survived a number of cautions that repeatedly tightened the field for the win.

After his win, Tellstrom recalled the lap 132 winning pass that saw he and Jefferson battling side by side with fenders banging and spark flying.

"It was a little wild", Tellstrom recalled. "Meridian is a lot different than most tracks and I respect Jason a lot and the Jefferson guys a lot. He caught me by surprise on that one restart and we started tagging. Meridian is really tight. I feel when I run the bottom, I am pretty nice and pretty disciplined. He kept squaring the exit off and it just doesn't work here this way. I couldn't go any lower."

Jefferson recalled the action with Tell-strom, as they battled for the lead on multiple restarts over the last 75 laps of the race.

"I really don't know what I was lacking", Jefferson speculated. "I think it may have just been a lack of experience here, is what it was. Obviously, he had a better car, and he's got a lot of laps around here."

NWSLM points leader Kasey Kleyn had his three-race series win streak snapped because he was hundreds of miles away racing at the ARCA West event at Tri City Raceway.

The next series race is Sept. 1 with the Labor Day Spectacular 125 at Hermiston Raceway, Oregon.

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
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
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
