
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SPOKANE VALLEY CITY COUNCIL | TUESDAY, OCTOBER 8, 2024 | MEETING RECAP

This week's Spokane Valley City Council meeting began with an invocation, pledge of allegiance led by Daisy Girl Scouts from Troop 2446 and approval of the meeting agenda.

Council Reports

Councilmembers shared brief updates on their recent involvement in various activities, meetings, events, etc.

General Public Comments

Each week, community members have an opportunity to address Councilmembers for up to three minutes during the General Public Comment period, either at the beginning or end of each meeting in person or via Zoom.

ACTION ITEMS

#1 Consent Agenda

The Council unanimously approved the consent agenda, which included vouchers for paying city expenses, payroll, and Council meeting minutes from Aug. 13 and 20, 2024.

#2 First Reading: Ordinance #24-013 Levying 2025 Regular Property Taxes

The Council received a report on this item on Sept. 24 and the first of three public hearings on the draft 2025 budget was held on Sept. 17. There are multiple taxing jurisdictions and tax code areas (TCA) within Spokane Valley. As an example, the collected property taxes within TCA-144 (the largest of the six TCAs in Spokane Valley) are currently distributed as follows: Central Valley School District: 31%, Spokane Valley Fire District No. 01: 26%, State School: 23%, City of Spokane Valley: 8%, Spokane County: 8%, and Spokane County Library District: 4%. The proposed 2025 property tax levy does not include the 1% increase permitted by state law. The levy does include property taxes on new construction. If approved, the ordinance would allow the City to collect approximately \$14.1 million in 2025, based on the Spokane County Assessor's preliminary estimated assessed property values. A motion was made to advance Ordinance #24-013, levying regular property taxes for 2025, to a second reading. The motion passed with six votes in favor and one vote against.

#3 Barker Road Grade Separation Project Final Change Order Approval:

On June 30, 2020, the Council approved an Interlocal Agreement with WSDOT to administer and provide construction management for this project, which was completed in November 2023. For the past ten months, WSDOT and city staff have been coordinating with the contractor on unresolved issues encountered during the construction. All parties have agreed upon compensable amounts for 13 change orders, which were summarized by staff. After the final change orders are complete, the final contract amount will be \$14,323,469. The City budgeted \$20,540,000 for construction, which includes \$17,950,149 from federal and state grants. A motion was made to authorize the city manager to finalize and execute the change order totaling \$596,329.75. The motion passed unanimously.

#4 City LTAC Application for a \$2.5 Million Lodging Tax Grant Award from Facilities Fund #104 to Further Construction of the Cross Course

This item was discussed by the Council at the Sept. 24 meeting. Staff shared in-

formation about the Spokane Valley Cross Course project and highlighted prior actions taken by the Council. Construction is currently underway and should be complete by fall 2025. The estimated project cost is approximately \$7 million, and the project has already been awarded \$4.4 million from LTAC Fund #104, \$150,000 from the State Legislature and a \$26,000 grant from Union Pacific Railroad. There is a \$2.6 million funding gap, and staff requests the Council's authorization to submit a 2025 Lodging Tax Grant Application to cover the gap. Staff announced that out of more than 1,200 bids from other organizations, the NCAA selected the future Spokane Valley Cross Course as the host site for the 2027 Division 1 Cross Country Regionals. A motion was made to authorize city staff to submit a 2025 Lodging Tax Grant Application, in partnership with Spokane Sports, for \$2.5 million from the Lodging Tax Facilities Fund #104 to partially fund construction of a cross course. The motion passed unanimously.

NON-ACTION ITEMS

#5 City Manager Presentation of Preliminary 2025 Budget

City Manager Hohman summarized the city's 2025 priorities and goals set by the Council. He reviewed financial management and financial objective policies and provided an overview of the estimated total revenues and expenditures for 2025. Public safety expenses account for 64% of the city's general fund expenditures. Line items for the 2025 Capital Projects budget, major transportation projects and economic development initiatives were discussed. The city manager discussed the 2025 budget challenges including decreasing tax revenues, public safety considerations, the growth rate of law enforcement costs, difficulty fully funding a pavement management program, and funding for housing and homeless services. The City has again developed a balanced budget and remains in excellent financial condition overall.

#6 Consolidated Five-Year Plan Update

Information about the Consolidated Five-Year Plan, which is designed to help local jurisdictions assess affordable housing and community development needs, was provided in the meeting packet. The plan is being updated by Spokane County Housing and Community Development with input from numerous regional stakeholders, including Spokane Valley.

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Fishing Magician

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There is a lot going on here for anglers in the region. Everything from fall Chinook in the Hanford Reach, and a lot of Coho staged off the mouth of the Wenatchee River, waiting for some rain to raise the level of the stream so they can make their way up to the Icicle. There is even some good spiny ray action on area lakes to take advantage

Last Sunday I went down to Crescent Bar to see the results of the Quincy Chamber of Commerce Pike Minnow Derby. There was a line at the weigh in station when I arrived, and chamber staff and volunteers were busy weighing and measuring the fish that people had caught. I learned that although the overall registrations were down from last year, they had the highest number of kids signed up this year. The Youth Division winner for most fish was won by Makenzie Nelson, who turned in over 11 pounds of pike minnows. In the Adult Division, Kevin Halbert weighed in 83.5 pounds of pike minnows to take the prize. This year the Grand Prize was a Polaris side by side and was won by the team of Brian Main and Dave Munson. You can see all the winners of each division for both weight and length on the Quincy Valley Chamber Facebook page. This week's photo is of Makenzie Nelson, with the trophy she won.

Fishing for perch is one of the most popular things to do in our area, and there are some great places to find them. I can make a short drive from my home in Leavenworth and catch as many as I want to fillet at Fish Lake. Much larger

perch can be found in other lakes. Many folks were pleased to hear that the fishing season was extended on Park and Blue lakes, north of Soap Lake. I have had some reports of perch up to 14 inches taken on these lakes, and I plan to give Blue Lake a try as soon as possible. Another lake that is known to produce good catches of perch is Moses Lake. When you see anglers on the I-90 Bridge near Blue Heron Park, you know the perch have moved into this area. Fishing for perch from the rip rap here is particularly good in the fall, right up to when the lake freezes and then they are caught through the ice. Another good place to look for perch in the fall on Moses Lake is at the south end near the outlets. I plan on doing a video of where to catch perch on Moses Lake very soon and I will let you know when it is posted to the Dave Graybill YouTube channel.

I have been watching the number of steelhead that have been passing over Priest Rapids Dam very closely, and they have been very encouraging. It has been a long time since we have had a steelhead season on the upper Columbia, and I have been holding out hope that this could be the year. We not only need good numbers of wild fish to reach our area, but also the right ratio of hatchery fish. If we get too many wild fish, then we hit the mortality



quota way too early

to allow for a fishery. It's complicated, I know, but it looks like the stars may all align for us fans of steelhead fishing this year. When you ask other anglers what their favorite fish to catch might be, and if they have experienced the thrill of seeing a steelhead leap out of the water and tear line off their reel, they will most likely answer, steelhead. My wife is a fairly fair-weather angler, but if I suggest a steelhead trip in the winter, she's raring to go! I will continue to monitor the progress of steelhead to our region, and keep you posted on the potential of a season.

I checked on the Icicle late last week, to see if the recent rain had raised the level of the stream, maybe even spot some Coho nosing up the upper end below the hatchery. There was an angler casting a fly when I arrived, and I got to visit with him. He was casting to some Coho! He said he saw a big one roll just down around the corner the last evening, too. The recent rain had raised the level of the Icicle just slightly, but it was enough to move a few fish into the stream. I checked the counts when I got home and there were over 14,000 Coho over Rock Island Dam by the 25th of September, and only 4,800 over Rocky Reach. There could be as many as 10,000 Coho waiting off the mouth of the Wenatchee or somewhere between there and the Icicle! When we

> get some more rain, they will be pouring into the Wenatchee and up the Icicle. It's going to be fun. I want to remind folks that as of October 1st several lakes in the region close for the season. Be sure to check the registers before you head out to your favorite lake.

As many of you know Omak Lake is one of my favorite places to fish in the fall. The lake is on the Colville Reservation, just eight miles from the town of Omak, and gets very little pressure. It is not unusual for me to be out there with no other boats in sight. I'm sure the reason is that to fish here you need a Colville Tribal fishing license. The addition of the need for a Colville Reservation Access Permit and Launch Fee has been a deterrent for most folks to fish

here. I have been fishing tribal waters for many years and have had terrific fishing at Buffalo Lake, Twin Lakes and on the San Poil River. I fish Rufus Woods frequently and use the launch at the middle net pens, so I have what I need to fish Omak Lake anyway. We have some beautiful sunny and calm days in October and the fishing is incredible for the big Lahontan cutthroat that inhabit the lake. It is not unusual for me and my fishing partners to catch and release ten or more fish an hour trolling a variety of spoons and plugs. It really is amazing.





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NOXIOUS WEEDS

What is a Noxious Weed? They are non-native plants that have been introduced to Spokane County through human actions. Because of their aggressive growth and lack of natural enemies, these species can be destructive, competitive, and difficult to control.



COMMON MULLEIN

(VERBASCUM THAPUS)

This plant develops rosette in its first year then sends up a tall, flowering stalk the second year. Grows over 6ft tall and is covered in dense, wooly hair. Leaves are elliptic to ovate and opposite on the stem. Flowers are 5 lobed and yellow, growing in long, terminal spikes. Taprooted; spreads by seed. Plants are easily pulled due to the shallow taproot.

Tilling will kill the plant, but may expose buried seeds for germination. Spraying is most effective in the first year rosette stage. Livestock will not eat due to its woolliness.

TRESPASSING



We live in a day and time when anarchists have run wild in some parts of our country and many people excuse their crimes of trespassing, theft, vandalism and even assault in order to promote what they perceive to be a greater cause. While I am sympathetic to any righteous cause, certain restraint is always advisable. We've always held as truth in this country that two wrongs don't make a right!

While thinking about those assaults against property owners, it occurred to me that a similar but less abusive lack of courtesy occurs frequently in the real estate business. That usually happens when people assume that when a For Sale sign is placed on a property, they have the automatic right to go snoop around, which couldn't be further from the truth.

Owning property in this country is one of our basic rights that should not be taken for granted. As part of that ownership, the landowner can reasonably expect that no one may enter that property without permission. A For Sale Sign does NOT give that permission! Criminal trespass in the first degree is legally described as a gross misdemeanor, which is knowingly entering a property of another without first gaining permission.

I recently received a call from a well meaning trespasser who called to let me know that someone was "squatting" in a vacant home I had listed. As it turns out, the seller was staying temporarily in the home while doing some work on the property and the evidence of a squatter was the seller's own untidy personal belongings. The informant had only noticed the evidence of occupancy because they were on the property uninvited, peaking through the windows like a Peeping Tom. The irony of that situation is that the well meaning informant was the trespasser.

Brokers frequently post sign riders on For Sale signs that specify "Showing By Appointment Only." While that posted declaration designates specific access limitations, the lack of such signage does not indicate free reign access. On properties without such signage, permission must also be granted before any access is legal.

Buyers or tire-kickers should always be careful to avoid becoming a trespasser on listed properties! Since the broker is an agent of the seller, they are able to grant permission for access based on the sellers contracted showing instructions. Therefore a call to the listing or selling broker is always a condition before a viewing can occur, even when the property is vacant land.

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


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KLEYN CAPS CHAMPIONSHIP SEASON WITH FALL CLASSIC VICTORY | From NWSLM Media & NW Motorsports News Services

West Richland, Wash. - Kasey Kleyn made it a weekend to remember when he clinched the Northwest Super Late Model Series presented by RaceCals championship, as well as scoring one of the biggest wins of his young career.

Kleyn grabbed the lead for the first time on lap 175 and led the rest of the way for a \$10,000 victory in the 37th Annual "Fall Classic 200" on Oct. 6 at Tri-City Raceway in front of a packed grandstand.

The win comes after Kleyn had nearly won several Super Late Model events at the ½-mile tri-oval. He just missed victories in both the season opening Apple Cup as well as the 2023 Fall Classic.

"It means a lot" Kleyn said "We have tried super, super hard and come so close in the 'Apple Cups', and we came so close in the 'Fall Classic,' Kleyn said. "To get this win really solidifies everything. We get our name on a hoodie, and we are so happy we finally did it."

It was not an easy victory for the Quincy, WA teenager. He opened the day's competition by earning the AFCO Racing / Longacre Racing Products Fast Time Award with a lap of 17.714 seconds in a field of 32 drivers.

On lap 93 Kleyn slowed on the backstretch with what turned out to be a broken axle. With fuel issues a concern, the series called for the break at that point, with teams allowed to change two tires.

The pause in the on-track action gave the team time to make necessary repairs.

"I was really worried", Kleyn said. "The break couldn't have come at a better time. We lost the axle and then we went to break, which allowed us to call my dad to get the axle out of the trailer. It wasn't down here, so it took a lot to get to the axle and we barely got it in time. I am just really grateful to my crew. They really busted their butts to get that taken care of and get us back on track."

The caution flew once again on lap 142, as Scott Walker spun from the seventh-place position, after contact from Kleyn. Both drivers went to the tail of the field for the

By lap 159 Kleyn was on the move, join-

ing the lead pack and on lap 163, he moved into the top five for the first time and on 175 Kleyn was in the lead for good.

With laps clicking off, it looked like Kleyn was home free, before Andy Beaman spun in Turn 1, just in front of the leader. That gave the field one more shot at the 2024 series champion, in an eight-lap shootout.

After his Victory Lane celebration, Kleyn talked about the most challenging part of the 200-lap affair.

"Going from day to night and keeping your left sides (tires) on for 200 laps", Kleyn related as his biggest race challenge. "The weather change definitely changed all the cars."

After a five-win season in the Northwest Super Late Model Series season, Kleyn was excited to take home the championship, and looks forward to the future.

"It feels really good, we worked hard all season", Kleyn stated. "I think that was our fifth win of the season. We finished inside the top three in a lot of them. We probably could have had a couple more wins if things had gone a little better, but we still powered through.

As for past Fall Classic winers in the field, defending champion Evan Goetz was eighth, 2016 winner Jason Jefferson 20th with 2022 winner, Donnie Wenat 24th and 2006's titlist, BJ Tidrick in 32nd spot.

The father / son combo of John Dillon and Johvan Dillon pulled the number one and two pills earning a unique spot in race history on the front row in the top eight redraw of fastest qualifiers.

Greg Biffle photo Semi-retired NASCAR Cup driver and Vancouver, Wash. native Greg Biffle put on his helping hands hat following Hurricane Helene only to be thwarted in his efforts by federal officials according to Newsweek.

Biffle was nominated for the Presidential Medal of Freedom on social media for his efforts after Helene created a swath of devastation up the interior Eastern seaboard and the Appalachian Mountains.

But according to Biffle and Elon Musk, the Federal Emer-

gency Management Administration (FEMA) refused to allow personal helicopters from delivering aid.

While Biffle teamed with Polaris to provide generators, Musk had planned to provide in the neighborhood of 200 Starlink satellite systems to provide communication that was lost to the storm.

Newsweek reported that Musk went on his social media platform, X (formerly Twitter) to explain how people aren't allowed to transport essential supplies by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA).

"SpaceX engineers are trying to deliver Starlink terminals & supplies to devastated areas in North Carolina right now and @FEMA is both failing to help AND won't let others help. This is unconscionable!!" Musk posted.

Biffle said "He made six landing attempts before finally succeeding, due to the challenging terrain," the Newsweek account noted.

Survivors on the ground got Biffle's attention by using signal mirrors which generated the X post that followed.

"The mirror that caught our attention well over a mile away; only way we were able to find someone stranded in the mountains at bottom of steep canyon. 6 attempts to land due to difficulty but we got there - got him a chainsaw, EpiPens, insulin, chicken food, formula, gas, 2 stroke oil, and sandwiches premade from Harris Teeter before we left #hurricanehelene."





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
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Plan a Spa Bathroom Remodel

Certain features can transform home bathrooms into spa-like retreats with a few touches.



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

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
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Major Appliances

Refrigerator

Adjust the temperature. Set your refrigerator between 37 to 40° F and your freezer between 0 to 5° .

Keep the refrigerator door closed. Know what you want out of the refrigerator before you open the door. An open door is wasted energy.

Defrost freezer. Defrost when ice is ¼" thick.

Clean refrigerator coils. Keep coils clean to keep your refrigerator in peak operating condition. They may be behind or below the fridge.

Cover and wrap food. Uncovered foods and liquid release moisture, which makes the fridge work

Fill it up. A full refrigerator or freezer uses less energy. Fill with jugs of water to take up space.

Range / Oven

Keep racks clear. Keep racks clear. It's tempting to line oven racks with foil to keep things clean, but don't do it. The hot air needs to be able to circulate to cook food efficiently.

Use lids. When cooking, lids keep heat and steam in and help food cook more quickly, which saves

Clean the burner pans on your stove. When clean, burner pans will reflect heat back up to pots and pans. Don't peek. You lose heat every time you open the door or lift the lid.

Use the smallest pans possible. It takes less energy to heat smaller pans. Try to match the size of the pot or pan to the size of the burner and cover pots when cooking.

Dishwasher

Fill it up. It costs exactly the same to wash one dish as it does to wash a full load of dishes.

Scrape dishes instead of pre-rinsing them. Dishwashers made in the past five to ten years can clean even heavily soiled dishes without pre-

Use air-dry options. Keep your machine from using a heating element to bake your dishes dry and opt to air dry your dishes instead.

Laundry

Select cold water. Hot water only needs to be used for very dirty loads.

Only run full loads. The machine uses about the same amount of water whether you wash a full load or just one item.

Hang it up. Instead of using the dryer, dry clothes outside in good weather—sunlight is free.

Clean the lint filter after every load. Clogged filters drive up drying time and costs.

Electronics

Kitchen

Smaller is better. For small meals, utilize the microwave, toaster oven, electric pans or other kitchen gadgets to avoid heating up the whole oven for one toasted cheese sandwich.

Skip the oven. In warm weather, cook outdoors

Shut off kitchen fans. While fans are great for removing smells from the kitchen, they also remove heat. Shut them off when you don't need

Unplug it. Your toaster should only be plugged in when you are using

Family Room / Living Room / Office

Unplug it. Battery chargers or power adapters for devices like cell phones, eBooks and more may draw power even when they're not in use—don't let them.

Use power strips. Plug your video game consoles, stereo, DVD players and any other home electronics into a single power strip so you can switch it off and cut all power to items at once.

Try "smart" power strips. They can help reduce your power usage by shutting down power to products that are not in use or that go into standby mode.

Turn computers off. Sleep modes save energy, but it's better to use none. Turn off the monitor if you'll be away for 20 minutes or more, and turn off your computer if you'll be away for 2 hours or longer.

Other Considerations:

Hot tubs. Check the condition of your cover for escaping steam and use insulation blankets in the winter to keep the water nice and toasty.

Heated shops. Heated garages and outbuildings are easy to forget about in the winter and can contribute to a lot of extra energy use.


Heated driveways. Although these come in super handy in the winter, they too can contribute to a large increase in energy consumption.

RV use. Plugging an RV into your home's electrical system can increase energy use dramatically, especially during the winter when its heating system works overtime to keep the unit warm.

Holidays. Extra house guests mean extra cooking, dishes, laundry and showers. This extra activity also means extra energy use. Be sure to use LEDs for any holiday lighting décor, as the energy used by just one regular bulb can power 140 LEDs. If you're planning to be away from home for an extended period of time, lower your thermostat and water heater temperature to prevent unnecessary energy use.

School breaks. Having kids home during the day may mean that lights are on more often, additional electronics are plugged in or charging, and the thermostat is adjusted to maintain a comfortable temperature. All of these activities use more

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Outside Electrical Work

- Have a qualified electrician do all electrical work.
- To prevent an electrical shock, make sure all your outside electrical receptacles are GFCI (groundfault circuit interrupter) protected.

Equipment Safety

- Use lighting and power tools that are listed by a qualified test laboratory and make sure they are made for outdoor use.
- Store your electrical tools indoors.
- Keep electric tools away from children.
- Keep the area around your electric meter and other electrical equipment clear.
- Check lighting and extension cords for damage before using. Replace any damaged cords right
- Use extention cords that are listed by a qualified test laboratory and are marked for outdoor use.
- Extension cords are not meant for long-term use.

POWER LINES

Have a professional tree cutting service trim branches that might fall on electric wiring. Use a wooden or fiberglass ladder outside. Keep the ladder at least 10 feet away from power lines. Never touch anyone or anything in contact with a downed wire. Power lines may be live, stay a safe distance away. Report downed wires to authorities right away.
