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SPOKANE VALLEY CITY COUNCIL | TUESDAY, FEBRUARY 18, 2025 | MEETING RECAP

This week's Spokane Valley City Council meeting began with the pledge of allegiance, approval of the following meeting agenda, and approval to excuse of Councilmember Yaeger's absence.

General Public Comments

Each week, community members have an opportunity to address Councilmembers for up to three minutes during the General Public Comment period, either at the beginning or end of each meeting in person or via Zoom.

ACTION ITEMS

#1 Street and Stormwater Maintenance and Repair Services Contract

Staff outlined the recent bid process and reported Inland Asphalt, Inc. as the lowest responsive and responsible bidder. The contract will be in effect until Dec. 31, 2025 with options to extend up to three additional one-year terms. Costs for work done through this contract will be paid from Fund #101 Street Fund and Fund #402 Storm Management Fund.

A motion to award the Street and Stormwater Maintenance and Repair Services contract to Inland Asphalt, Inc. in an amount not to exceed \$1,500,000 and to authorize the City Manager to finalize and execute the contract passed with 5 votes in favor and 1 vote against.

#2 Street Sweeping Services Contract Award

Staff described the recent Request for Proposals process and reported that AAA Sweeping was the lowest responsive and responsible bidder. The contract may be extended up to four additional one-year terms, if mutually agreed upon. There are sufficient funds in the budget to cover the cost of the contract.

A motion to award the 2025 Street Sweeping Services contract to AAA Sweeping in an amount not to exceed \$748,744.00 and authorize the City Manager to finalize and execute the contract passed with 5 votes in favor and 1 vote against.

#3 Grant Opportunity: WSDOT Active Transportation Assistance Program

This program has set aside state funds for local governments to develop high-quality active transportation plans (non-motorized) in order to improve competitiveness with funding programs like Safe Routes to School and the Pedestrian-Bicycle Program. Participation in the Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT) Active Transportation Plan grant opportunity is by invitation only. Spokane Valley was one of ten agencies invited to participate. The City is eligible to receive between \$50,000 to \$150,000 of state funding and there is no local match required.

A motion to authorize the City Manager or designee to enter into an agreement with WSDOT for the development of an Active Transportation Plan passed with 5 votes in favor and 1 vote against.

#4 Consultant Contract for Comprehensive Plan Periodic Update

The city's Comprehensive Plan Periodic Update

must be completed by June 30, 2026. In Aug. 2024, the Council authorized the city to apply for a Dept. of Commerce grant to assist with the costs associated with developing the plan update. The WA Dept. of Commerce allocated \$1.025 million of grant funding to the city. Staff summarized the Request for Qualifications (RFQ) process for consultant services to assist with the plan update. Community Attributes Inc (CAI) was selected as the recommended consultant; CAI also facilitated the city's plan update in 2016. The full contract amount of \$1.025 million is covered through allocated Dept. of Commerce grants.

A motion to authorize the City Manager to sign the contract with Community Attributes Inc. passed with 5 votes in favor and 1 vote against.

#5 Motion to Deny City Funding for Councilmember Merkel's Defense Against the Court Action Filed to Compel His Compliance with the Washington Public Records Act and City Council Governance Manual

The City has initiated legal action against Councilmember (CM) Merkel based on claims that CM Merkel has violated City policy (i.e. the Council's Social Media Policy) and failed to produce records in violation of the Public Records Act (PRA). The purpose of this legal action is to compel CM Merkel to comply with the Social Media Policy as well as preserve and produce public records as required by the PRA, in order to enable the City to fully comply with its obligations under the PRA and avoid being held financially liable for PRA lawsuits that may be filed against the City due to CM Merkel's actions. A copy of the court filing was included in the Council's meeting packet. Council was asked to determine if CM Merkel is or is not entitled to City-funded legal representation.

A motion to (1) find that the Complaint filed with the Washington Superior Court for Spokane County under Case No. 25-2-00710-32 was filed by the City against Councilmember Merkel and claims he is failing to comply with the Washington Public Records Act and the Council's Social Media Policy, and (2) deny Councilmember Merkel any City-funded legal representation in connection with Case No. 25-2-00710-32 pursuant to SVMC 2.70.030(A)(4) and (5) passed with 5 votes in favor and 0 votes against (CM Merkel did not vote on this item due to his conflict of interest).

NON-ACTION ITEMS

#6 Interlocal Agreement with Spokane County: Spokane Regional Stormwater Manual Update

The city's stormwater utility partners with neighboring jurisdictions to collaborate on stormwater efforts including those requirements by the WA Dept. of Ecology. Staff propose entering into an ILA with Spokane County to contract with a stormwater consultant to evaluate the existing regional stormwater manual against new permit requirements and apply necessary updates. Council reached consensus for

this item return at future meeting for approval for the City Manager to execute the draft ILA.

#7 Proposed Resolution 25-002 Setting a Public Hearing for Street Vacation STV-2025-0001

Staff shared details about a privately initiated street vacation request to vacate a 20'x195' (estimated 4,068 sq ft) alleyway segment located east of the intersection of Appleway Avenue and Greenacres Road.

A consensus was reached to schedule Res. 25-002 on the Feb. 25, 2025 consent agenda, which will set the public hearing at the March 27, 2025 Planning Commission meeting.

#8 2025 Capital Improvement Projects

Staff highlighted construction projects for 2025 including Greenacres Park Phase 2, Improvements on Barker Rd from Appleway to Sprague, Wellesley Ave Preservation, Sullivan Park Waterline, Sprague Ave Pedestrian Crossings, Thorpe Bridge-Superstructure Replacement, Citywide Reflective Backplates, Sprague Ave Preservation – Bowdish to McDonald, and Pines Rd/BNSF Grade Separation.

#9 American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Related Funds Update – Law Enforcement Assistance

SVPD Chief Dave Ellis and Spokane Valley staff provided a background on the ARPA funds allocated to the city in 2021 and uses of the funding to date, including purchasing police vehicles, the camera trailer and gang emphasis patrols. They outlined the proposed projects for use of the remaining funds: (1) to acquire and operate cameras in city parks for security purposes and (2) for SVPD acquire and operate license plate reader cameras for law enforcement related purposes. Council reached consensus for this item to be brought back at a future meeting.

#10 Budget and Finance Overview – Part One

Staff provided a high-level overview of common standards and procedures of municipal government accounting and budgeting. This is in preparation for in-depth budget discussions by Council on March 4 and June 10.

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
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
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The cold weather has really expanded the opportunities for ice fishermen throughout the region. Even some lakes at lower elevations are sporting a solid cap of ice, and anglers are taking advantage of it.

It was kind of a different day at Roses Lake last Friday. When I arrived, there was one angler there, catching trout. I had trouble with my auger, so he drilled a hole for me. Later, another angler came over saying he was out of propane and had to go into town. I had an extra tank in my truck so, he ran up, got the propane and headed back out to meet his Dad and look for perch. When I was dragging my sled to my truck, I happened to see a cell phone laying on top of the snow and ice. It had slipped out of the pocked of the angler when he came back down to the lake with the propane tank. I walked out and gave it to him, and he was very grateful. Then an angler came down and said he hadn't ever ice fished before, but had heard it was pretty good on Roses. He didn't have an auger, so I directed him to four recently drilled holes. He asked if the fish would hit a bare jig, since he didn't have any bait. I gave him my carton of worms and wished him luck. It was a beautiful sunny day at Roses last Friday. The ice was about five inches thick, and trout were biting. This week's photo is of an angler with one of the trout he caught that morning.

If you want to put in your two cents worth on upper Columbia salmon and steelhead fisheries, you will have a chance to do it at the North of Falcon public meeting. This is where WDFW staff will present their plans for the next year, and these meetings take place during the process. The actual North of Falcon planning takes a few months to complete. When I was serving as a WDFW Commissioner I went to meetings on these fisheries all over the state, even a couple in California and Portland, Oregon. The North of Falcon meetings culminate with meetings with the Tribes. These meetings can be very contentious, and back then, as a Commissioner, I was allowed to sit in on them. The discussions take several days, and even into the evenings. The WDFW technical staff works closely with their tribal counterparts to make complicated adjustments as the meetings progress, and it is exhausting work. This is your chance to participate in the process. The meeting is on March 18th at the Confluence Technology Center, 285 Technology Center Way, in Wenatchee from 4 to 7 p.m. You can see a timeline of all the meetings and details of the Wenatchee meeting by Googling North of Falcon.

The Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife has planted about 80,000 juvenile steelhead in Rock Lake near Sprague. The state planted the ocean running fish in the lake because of a change at the Tokul Creek Fish Hatchery in King County in Western Washington. Fish and Wildlife is no longer raising steelhead at that hatchery to protect wild steelhead. The final



population of steelhead reared at the hatchery last year need to be planted in a location where they cannot impact wild fish. State officials chose Rock Lake because of its excellent habitat and since it's not connected to waters where wild steelhead are present. The small steelhead that were planted in Rock Lake were ten to the pound. They are expected to reach a catchable size of about 11 inches by late this summer. The rules for fishing steelhead in Rock Lake are the same as the statewide regulations for trout. Steelhead are normally an ocean-going species that return to their home rivers to spawn but they also thrive in large lakes. More juvenile steelhead will be planted in Rock Lake this spring.

As many of you know, I have been sending out a free Quarterly E-Letter for the past 18 years. The E-Letter contained feature stories on the best fishing during a particular season, and

a forecast of the best prospects in the Summer, Fall, Winter and Summer. The Winter E-Letter was sent out a couple of weeks ago and was dedicated to Winter Trout Fishing. Of course, there was a lot of information about ice fishing and shore fishing in this issue. Those who now subscribe to the E-Letter receive Monthly Updates, in addition to the Quarterly editions. These updates give people information on the progress of fisheries of primary interest to anglers in the region and any new developments in the list of Top Prospects. Included in the Update for Winter, anglers can also expect to see interviews with guides and local experts, and even How-to Videos that are only seen by subscribers. To learn

how to get on the subscribers list, go to the E-Letter link on the FishingMagician.com website. Just click on E-Letter and it will open a page with a form to sign up, and to pay the \$24.99 annual fee. Just two buck a month! Sign up now and I will be sure you will get the Winter issue and the Update.

Ever wondered what some wild game meat would taste like? Your opportunity is coming up on Saturday, March 29th. The Wenatchee Sportsmen's Association will be holding their annual fundraising

dinner and auction on that evening, and if you haven't attended one of these events, I suggest you get tickets and go. The menu is something that is different than any other dining experience you have had, prepared by great chefs. In addition to the dinner, it is a very busy evening. There will be tables full of "gotta have" items for those who hunt and fish, and the live action is just that—very lively. When you buy your ticket, it is good for the dinner and a year's membership to the organization. The Wenatchee Sportsmen's Association volunteers dedicate hundreds of hours every year to fish and wildlife habitat and ecological work, all right here in our area. They have participated in the Rock Island Kids Free Fishing Day for many years, helping kids catch a fish. For some of them it's their first ever! The event will take place at the St. Joseph Catholic Church in Wenatchee, beginning at 4:30. You can get tickets at Hooked on Toys.





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Attract Winged Friends with these Bird Feeders



Birds are beautiful creatures that can make a lawn and garden feel even more serene. Providing snacks to supplement what birds naturally find in the wild guarantees up close and personal interactions with the scores of species that call neighborhoods home.

Bird feeders are particularly important in colder climates and during wintertime when food may be scarce. Keeping birds well fed helps them survive over winter and continue to repopulate in the spring. Bird feeding isn't all for the birds, either. Ashley Dayer, an associate professor in the Department of Fish and Wildlife Conservation at Virginia Tech, argues that feeding birds also is a benefit to humans because it stimulates compassion for the animals.

The type of bird feeder a person places in the yard determines which species may be drawn to the property. The following are various types of feeders to consider.

Suet feeders

Suet cakes are high-energy food sources that attract birds like woodpeckers and nuthatches. They are particularly beneficial in colder months or regions where birds need extra fat for energy. These cage-like feeders snap around the rectangular suet cake and hang from a pole or tree.

Ground feeder

Ground feeders are simple screen-bottomed trays that sit several inches off of the ground or on a deck to help keep seeds and grain from coming in contact with droppings. Ground feeders are a favorite of juncos, sparrows, and goldfinches, among others.

Sugar water feeder

These feeders come in different shapes, from tubes to round dishes, and are magnets to hummingbirds. The store-bought version usually has red coloring to be more attractive to these speed flyers, but a simple home-made version doesn't need all the extra dyes to be beneficial.

Hopper bird feeder

These are the feeders many people think of when they envision bird feeders. Hopper bird feeders hold a large amount of seed and often have a roof or a design that mimics a house or barn. The covered design helps to keep seeds dry and might be the best hanging feeder for people who live in areas with a lot of rain. Hoppers will attract blue jays and blackbirds.


Tube feeders

Tube feeders will attract an array of birds. They are cylindrical in shape with various ports to enable birds to perch and feed.

Window and smart bird feeders

These types of bird feeders attach to windows to allow homeowners to view the birds up close. Smart varieties have cameras on the feeders that will send a feed via an app to a smart phone or computer. Some even may identify the bird species on the feeder at any given point in time. Bird feeders provide enjoyment for bird watchers and nutritious food various species.

CONTRACT PERFORMANCE

Real Estate Trends & Advice



Invariably after real estate transactions are closed there are issues that surface where one of the principles is not happy because the contract was not fulfilled to their satisfaction. It is usually a buyer who finds something missing that was supposed to stay or something was left behind that was supposed to be removed from the property.

The first person they usually call is their real estate broker, probably because they have the mistaken perception that the broker is obligated to enforce the contract, when in reality the broker should only advise them to seek legal counsel. In some ways that expectation could be considered a compliment to the broker because that trust has been well earned, but the perception that the broker can, or are obligated to resolve all but the simplest post closing issues (like tracking down the keys) is misguided.

Brokers are easily lured into assuming the role of contract-enforcer just because most are motivated to provide extraordinary customer service, even though succumbing to that urge is usually a legal mine field for real estate brokers. It's easy to see why they frequently cave to that pressure whenever they have to face the wrath of a disgruntled party. To resist the urge to please can be difficult for all but the most disciplined brokers.

In one recent case a buyer scheduled a walk-through of a home more than a week prior to the closing, instead of waiting until just prior to their signing to assure that things were clean, in good repair and that all of the appliances were present. In their eagerness to get the walk through over with, that buyer may have created a situation where they would close and then find out later that things were awry.

In another example, a buyer had agreed to close if the seller would clean up a very messy property and remove all of the debris prior to closing. On the signing day the buyer decided to close even though the seller was still engaged in the process of removing mounds of debris. The deal recorded and funded without the contingency being satisfied. The buyer lost their power to enforce the seller's performance of the contract the second they agreed to allow it to be funded. Now that upset buyer is blaming brokers when it is the seller who has not performed according to the contract.

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

NOXIOUS WEEDS

What is a Noxious Weed? They are non-native plants that have been introduced to Spokane County through human actions. Because of their aggressive growth and lack of natural enemies, these species can be destructive, competitive, and difficult to control.



BULL THISTLE

(CIRSIUM VULGARE)

This biennial weed grows 3-7 feet tall with an upright, branching stem. Pink to purple flowers are clustered at the end of branches. Pull or dig small infestations. This plant must be cut off below the soils surface and no leaves should remain as the plant will recover. Horses, sheep, and goats may eat young plants, but they will avoid mature foliage.

LUCK, INSTINCTS GIVE BYRON REPEAT DAYTONA 500 WIN By Reid Spencer; NASCAR Wire Service

DAYTONA BEACH, FL. (February 16, 2025) - Like Houdini making an unlikely escape from a straitjacket, William Byron trusted his instincts and emerged from a smoky, last-lap wreck on the backstretch at Daytona International Speedway to win the DAYTONA 500 for the second straight time.

On Sunday night, after a long rain delay and a Presidential visit, Byron took full advantage when contact from Cole Custer turned three-time DAYTONA 500 winner Denny Hamlin at the front the field and started a wreck that gave Byron the opportunity he needed.

When Byron crossed the finish line 0.113 seconds ahead of runner-up Tyler Reddick in overtime, he became the first driver since Hamlin in 2019 and 2020 to win the Great American Race in consecutive years.

"Yeah, obviously some good fortune, but just trusted my instincts on the last lap there," Byron said after climbing from his car. "I felt like they were getting squirrelly on the bottom, and I was honestly going to go third (top) lane regardless, because I was probably sixth coming down the back."

Last season, Byron claimed all three of his NASCAR Cup Series victories in the first 11 races. This year, after another Daytona win, he plans to sustain the momentum throughout the season.

"It's an amazing race, and obviously a lot of crazy racing out there tonight and just a lot of pushing and shoving," said Byron, who picked up his third victory at the 2.5mile superspeedway and the 14th of his ca-

The wreck on the second lap of overtime frustrated both Hamlin, who was late to the lead and 2022 DAYTONA 500 winner Austin Cindric, who led a race, with high 59 laps and combined with Team Penske teammates Joey Logano and Ryan Blaney to lead 125

Hamlin had just pulled ahead of Cindric on the backstretch when Custer made a move to the outside and then steered down the track toward Hamlin's No. 11 Toyota, triggering the crash

Legacy Motor Club owner and part-time driver Jimmie Johnson finished third in his best result since 2020 at Dover. Pole winner Chase Briscoe was fourth and John Hunter Nemechek fifth, giving Legacy two drivers in the top five.

The race was just over four laps from completion in regulation when a bump from Custer turned Christopher Bell hard into the outside wall on Lap 196. Bell's Toyota bounced off the SAFER barrier and collected the Ford of Ryan Preece, whose car got airborne and landed on its roof before finishing upright.

That sort of wreck wasn't unfamiliar to Preece, who endured a spectacular series of barrel rolls in the 2023 spring race at Talla-

"When the car took off like that, it got really quiet, and all I thought about was my daughter," Preece said. "So, I'm lucky to walk away."

The 67th running of the Great America Race started in short bursts. With President Donald Trump in attendance and the grandstands packed with fans—reflective of a 10th straight sellout—drivers ran just nine green-flag laps from the start before rain interrupted the proceedings.

After a red flag period that lasted 3 hours, 9 minutes, 59 seconds, drivers took to the track for a second time and ran another 12 laps under caution before a brief rainstorm halted the race for another 20 minutes, 29 seconds.

Logano won the first stage under caution, but because of a problem with debris in the throttle body of his No. 22 Ford on the subsequent restart on Lap 71, Logano stacked up the top lane and ignited a seven car melee in Turn 1. The accident eliminated the cars of Martin Truex Jr., Helio Castroneves and Ross Chastain.

Intense three wide action throughout the race produced 56 lead changes among 15 drivers. Byron led five times for a total of 10 laps. There were eight cautions for 47 laps.
